The ANSWER project proposes a new approach to the creative process of film production by introducing DirectorNotation, a symbolic language designed to give directors the possibility of precisely documenting their artistic choices. Besides DirectorNotation, ANSWER aims to develop a complete software package that supports the pre-production stage in filmmaking: an editor for the symbolic language DirectorNotation and software for the digital visualisation (automatic animated storyboard) of the film being prepared.
