Charikleia Papageorgiadou is Research Director at the Institute of Historical Studies of the National Hellenic Research Foundation. Since 2011 she coordinates the Program "Economy and Society in the Hellenistic and Roman periods".

Her research interests focus on coinage as economic phenomenon in ancient societies, studied through local currencies and numismatic circulation, and especially, on the evolution of the monetary economy during Roman times in the Mediterranean basin and the Balkans (the penetration of the Roman Republican coins, the foundation of colonies, imperial financial policy etc).

Her published work includes three monographs: The Coinage of Kea, Μελετήματα 24 (Athens 1997), The numismatic iconography of the roman colonies in Greece. Local spirit and the expression of imperial policy, Μελετήματα 39 (Athens 2004), Athens Numismatic Museum. The Zarifis donation (Athens 2006), three collective volumes "Numismatic Archaeology-Archaeological Numismatics", Proceedings of an International Conference held to honour Dr. Mando Oeconomides in Athens 1995 (Oxbow Monograph 75, 1997) [with K.A. Sheedy], Sailing in the Aegean. Readings on the economy and trade routes, Μελετήματα 53 (Athens 2008) [with Angeliki Giannikouri], Réflexions sur la circulation des monnaies Romaines Républicaines. Les quadrigats en Occident et le deniers en Grèce/Orient [with P. Marchetti] (forthcoming), and more than forty papers in journals, conference proceedings and honorary volumes.
